1: **Cross-Cultural Leadership 501** (elective not required for credentials)

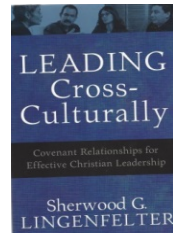

2: **Ministry to Muslims 502** (elective not required for credentials)

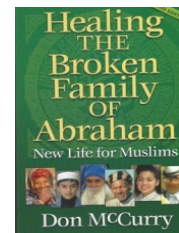

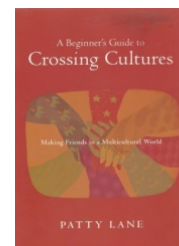
